Reaffirming LEADER's role in the CAP and beyond	Maintain LEADER as a core component of the CAP's second pillar, ensuring its visibility, continuity, and long-term impact.
	Secure dedicated funding (earmarking) for LEADER/CLLD across EU policies , particularly the CAP and Cohesion Policy. This recognises that rural development goes beyond agriculture and touches on economic, social, environmental, and territorial priorities.
	Promote a clear and inclusive definition of rural development , covering all aspects of rural and coastal life, to guide programming and investment decisions.
	Reframe the CAP narrative : rural development is not a niche concern, but the foundation of rural life. Vibrant rural areas are a precondition for sustainable farming, resilient food systems, and inclusive local economies.
A stronger mandate for participatory local development	Make LEADER/CLLD mandatory in all Member States where rural and coastal challenges exist, ensuring no territory is left behind.
	Double the EU's financial support for LEADER and LAGs to match their proven added value and growing responsibilities (fighting disinformation and euroscepticism).
	Mandate ring-fencing of funding for rural and participatory local development, to prevent discretionary exclusion at national or regional level.
Simplify and streamline funding and rules	Introduce a simplified, harmonised regulatory framework for multi-fund CLLD , enabling smoother implementation, especially for LAGs working across ESF+, ERDF and CAP.
	Cut red tape , especially administrative burdens added at the national level, which delay delivery and deter participation.
	Align EU-level simplification goals with Member State implementation , ensuring that the reality on the ground matches the ambition on paper.
Recognise LAGs as strategic governance partners	Acknowledge LAGs as delivery partners for EU strategic priorities —from the Green Deal and the Digital Decade to social inclusion and territorial cohesion.
	Position LAGs as key actors in democratic governance and European integration , thanks to their unique role in engaging communities, building trust, and countering disinformation at the local level.
