Rural Europe at the Heart of EU Priorities: CERSTE and ELARD Convene a High-Level Conference at the European Parliament

The event highlighted the strategic importance of rural areas and Local Action Groups (LAGs) within the forthcoming EU Multiannual Financial Framework 2028–2034.

On **30 September 2025**, the European Parliament hosted the international conference "Bringing Rural Areas and LAGs Back to the centre of European Attention", promoted by **CERSTE** (Centre Européen des Recherches Socio-Économiques, Technologiques et Environnementales) and co-organised with **ELARD** (European LEADER Association for Rural Development), with the **financial support of FederEdilizia**.

- The upcoming EU Budget 2028–2034 promises greater flexibility but also raises concerns about a potential weakening of cohesion policy — underscoring the need for strong political leadership to keep rural territories central to the European agenda.
- The **LEADER programme** remains a **pillar of local governance and community empowerment**, building social capital and driving innovation in rural areas.
- LAGs must preserve their decision-making autonomy and dedicated funding, to avoid being confined to agricultural functions and to maintain their role as catalysts of cross-sectoral rural development.
- Europe should move **beyond agricultural homogenisation**, recognising **territorial diversity and rural landscapes** as key assets for sustainable growth.
- Rural building renovation can evolve into a true industrial and social policy, countering depopulation and fostering community revitalisation.
- The Italian National Strategy for Inner Areas (SNAI) offers a successful placebased model, grounded in multi-level governance, co-design, and fund integration—showing how coordinated rural policy can inspire European innovation.
