LEADER-CLLD in the next MFF

Key asks from ELARD - November 2025

Reaffirm LEADER as part of the CAP and rural development

Maintain LEADER as a multi-sector territorial approach. LEADER must remain open to all actors in rural communities: SMEs, municipalities, cultural, youth, social, environmental and civic organisations.

Promote a clear and inclusive definition of rural development, covering all aspects of rural and coastal life, to guide programming and investment decisions; and a common understanding of LEADER-CLLD across policies.

Reframe the CAP narrative: rural development is not a niche concern, but the foundation of rural life. Vibrant rural areas are a precondition for sustainable farming, resilient food systems, and inclusive local economies.

Recognise LEADER-CLLD as contributing to the EU's social objectives by raising its social expenditure classification from 0% to at least 40%, reflecting its real impact on services, inclusion, youth, wellbeing and demographic resilience.

A stronger mandate for participatory local development

Make LEADER/CLLD mandatory in all Member States and across all policies, where rural and coastal challenges exist, ensuring no territory is left behind, with a mandatory ring-fencing.

Double the EU's financial support for LEADER and LAGs to match their proven added value and growing responsibilities (fighting disinformation and euroscepticism).

Simplify and streamline funding and rules

Cut red tape, especially administrative burdens added at the national level, which delay delivery and deter participation.

Align EU-level simplification goals with Member State implementation, ensuring that the reality on the ground matches the ambition on paper.

Recognise LAGs as strategic governance partners

Acknowledge LAGs as delivery partners for EU strategic priorities

Position LAGs as key actors in democratic governance and European integration, thanks to their unique role in engaging communities, building trust, and countering disinformation at the local level.

Restore full LAG decision-making competences, including preparation of project selection criteria, support levels and local calls, as currently defined in Article 33(3) Reg. 2021/1060.
